Class News and other bits

Forest Class

Another busy week in Forest Class. This week we have been reading the story 'Monkey Puzzle' by Julia Donaldson in Drawing Club. We have drawn our own animals in the forest as well as label them with the initial sounds we can hear in the words. In Maths we have been looking at 1:1 correspondence when counting on doing

this by counting drum beats, claps and other actions. The focus is saying a number name for each thing.

They did so well!

In RE we talked about God being a VIP to Christians and we painted and talked about VIPs in our lives. The children enjoyed painting these and they are on display for all to see in the corridor.

Reception Children - please ensure your book bag comes to school every day. We have also issued reading books to some who are starting to blend. Please make sure you write in the reading record to let us know how you are getting on at home. Also please return the books at the end of every week so we can swap it for you to take a new one home.

Ocean Class

We have had fun week in Ocean Class. In Maths we continue to explore numbers to 100 and comparing numbers within 10 to familiarise ourselves with new resources.

We continue to explore the story 'Pumpkin Soup' where we wrote about our favourite character from the story. The children have been encouraged to write independently and start to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

In RE we read the story 'Jonah and the Whale' where we acted out the story using the



parachute in the hall! We talked about the moral of the story which was focussed on listening and repenting for our sins.

Amazon Class

Another successful week in Amazon class this week. The children are really settled and comfortable with their new friends and routines.
