# **Privacy Notice (How we use pupil information)**

We collect, hold and share personal information relating to our pupils and may also receive information about them from their previous setting, local authority and/or the Department for Education (DfE).

# The categories of pupil information that we collect, hold and share include

This information will include their contact details, attendance information, where they go after they leave us and personal characteristics such as their ethnic group, any special educational needs they may have as well as relevant medical information.

# Why we collect and use this information

We use the pupil data to:

- apply for Early Education, SEN funding or Pupil Premium Funding
- · support our pupils' learning
- monitor and report on their progress
- · provide appropriate pastoral care; and
- · assess the quality of our services
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing

#### Under GDPR the lawful basis on which we use this information

We collect and use pupil information under our legal obligations to provide early years census data under section 537a of the Education Act 1996 and/or section 99 of the Childcare Act 2006. Collection and processing of special categories of personal data is undertaken for statistical purposes under article 9 of the general data protection regulations.

# Collecting pupil information

Whilst the majority of pupil information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with the General Data Protection Regulation, we will inform you whether you are required to provide certain pupil information to us or if you have a choice in this.

# Storing pupil data

- schools that the pupils attend after leaving us
- our local authority
- the Department for Education (DfE)

[For use by maintained schools only:] We are required to share information about our pupils with our local authority (LA) and the Department for Education (DfE) under section 3 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

[For use by <u>academies and free schools only</u>:] We are required to share information about our pupils with the Department for Education (DfE) under regulation 5 of The Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013.

# Requesting access to your personal data

Under data protection legislation, parents and pupils have the right to request access to information about them that we hold. - claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations
